



YEAR END REPORT

Dear Crime Stopper Supporters,

On behalf of the Board of the Pikes Peak Crime Stoppers (PPACS) I am happy to provide this year-end report of our past activities and achievements for 2021.

We received 1980 tips in calendar year 2021 which reflects a 5% increase from 2020. \$4450 rewards were paid in 2021, reflecting a 3% increase. In 2021, law enforcement agencies recovered \$33,740 in cash, \$83,360 in property, and seized \$892,675 in drugs from tips received by Pikes Peak Crime Stoppers. PPACS tips resulted in 42 arrests.

While the above statistics are impressive, we continue to grow awareness of our program in order to increase the number of tips we can forward to area law enforcement agencies. We know more tips results in more arrests and less crime in our community long-term.

To that end, we established the Crime Stoppers **REWARD FUND** in November 2021, soliciting contributions to the fund for the purpose of increasing reward values. Increased dollar incentives will result in additional tips for our law enforcement agencies. Increased reward amounts will benefit our Pikes Peak community.

In 2021 we expanded our collaborative relationships through MOUs with the Better Business Bureau (BBB), the Humane Society of Pikes Peak (HSPPR), the Home Builders Association (HBA), the MP Battalion at Ft. Carson, and the Peterson Schriever Garrison.

Goals for 2022 include continued expansion of the REWARD FUND, adding additional board members, conducting a regional event in collaboration with local law enforcement agencies, and raising awareness of the program.

We wish to thank our supporters for their generosity and support. Special thanks to the Gazette for the weekly insert of wanted persons in the Pikes Peak region. Thanks also to local electronic media for continuing to help us get the word out on expanded rewards. A special thanks to PPACS Board Members and the special volunteers operating our system as they continue to work toward our goals.
